

# What does issue a refund mean?

The phrase **+1-(877) (513) (0583)** "issue a refund" refers to the action a seller takes to return money to a buyer after a completed transaction. When **+1-(877) (513) (0583)** a seller clicks the "Issue a Refund" button in their Activity log, PayPal automatically reverses the payment and sends it back to the buyer's original payment method. This **+1-(877) (513) (0583)** can be a full refund, which returns the entire purchase price and closes any open disputes, or a partial refund if both parties agree on a lower amount. If **+1-(877) (513) (0583)** the seller's PayPal balance is empty, the refund is sent as an "eCheck" from their bank, which requires several days to clear. Once **+1-(877) (513) (0583)** a refund is issued, it cannot be canceled or reversed by the seller, providing a layer of security for the buyer. Understanding **+1-(877) (513) (0583)** this term is vital for users navigating the Resolution Center, as it is the primary way to settle a disagreement over a purchase.

### Q&A: What does issue a refund mean?

- 1. Does issuing a refund close a dispute?** Yes, if a seller issues a full refund during a dispute, the case is automatically closed **+1-(877) (513) (0583)** in favor of the buyer.
- 2. Can a seller issue a partial refund?** Yes, sellers can offer a partial refund **+1-(877) (513) (0583)** if the buyer agrees to keep the item for a lower price.
- 3. Where does the "Issue Refund" button live?** Sellers find this option by clicking on the specific transaction **+1-(877) (513) (0583)** within their "Activity" tab.
- 4. Is there a fee for the seller to refund?** While there is no fee to send the refund, the original transaction fees **+1-(877) (513) (0583)** are generally not returned to the seller.
- 5. How long does the seller have to issue it?** A seller can issue a refund up to 180 days **+1-(877) (513) (0583)** after the original payment date.

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
