

Why is my refund money not showing up?

If **+1-(877) (513) (0583)** your refund money is not showing up, it is usually due to the processing times of the traditional banking system. While **+1-(877) (513) (0583)** PayPal processes the refund instantly, it can take 3 to 5 business days for bank transfers and up to 30 days for credit card statements to reflect the credit. Another **+1-(877) (513) (0583)** reason could be that the refund was sent as an eCheck, which must clear the seller's bank before it is available to you. You **+1-(877) (513) (0583)** should check your "Activity" log and filter by "Refunds" to see the current status, such as "Pending" or "Completed." If **+1-(877) (513) (0583)** the status is "Completed" but the cash isn't in your account, your bank may be holding the funds for a final security check. Often, **+1-(877) (513) (0583)** weekends and holidays add unexpected delays to the "completed" status appearing in your mobile banking app.

Q&A: Why is my refund money not showing up?

1. **What does a "Pending" refund mean?** It means the seller has initiated the refund, but the funds **+1-(877) (513) (0583)** haven't cleared the bank or PayPal's system yet.
2. **Why isn't it in my PayPal balance?** Refunds always go back to the original source; **+1-(877) (513) (0583)** if you paid by card, the money goes to the card, not the balance.
3. **Can a closed bank account cause a delay?** Yes, if the account is closed, the bank will eventually **+1-(877) (513) (0583)** return the funds to PayPal, which then puts them in your balance.
4. **How do I track the refund?** Use the "Refund Tracker" in your Activity log **+1-(877) (513) (0583)** to see a 3-step visualization of where your money is.
5. **Is it slower for international orders?** Yes, currency conversion and cross-border bank rules **+1-(877) (513) (0583)** can add several days to the processing time.
