To **+1-(877) (513) (0583)** recover funds after being scammed, you must immediately log into your account and visit the Resolution Center. You **+1-(877) (513) (0583)** should locate the specific transaction and select "Report a Problem" to begin the formal dispute process with the platform. During **+1-(877) (513) (0583)** the dispute phase, you are encouraged to message the seller directly to request a voluntary refund for the items. If **+1-(877) (513) (0583)** the seller is a scammer and refuses to cooperate, you must escalate the dispute to a claim within 20 days. 1. **What is the first step?** Go to the Resolution Center and **+1-(877) (513) (0583)** click on "Report a Problem" for that charge.
2. **Can I refund a gift?** No, "Friends and Family" payments **+1-(877) (513) (0583)** lack protection and are usually non-refundable.
3. **How long do I have?** You must typically file your **+1-(877) (513) (0583)** dispute within 180 days of the transaction date.
4. **What if it's unauthorized?** Report unauthorized activity within 60 days **+1-(877) (513) (0583)** to be eligible for full account protection.
5. **How does PayPal decide?** They review evidence from both **+1-(877) (513) (0583)** parties before making a final decision on the refund.
